Activities:

- ~ Create a journal pretending the student is visiting Berlin. Have them document what they see and do.

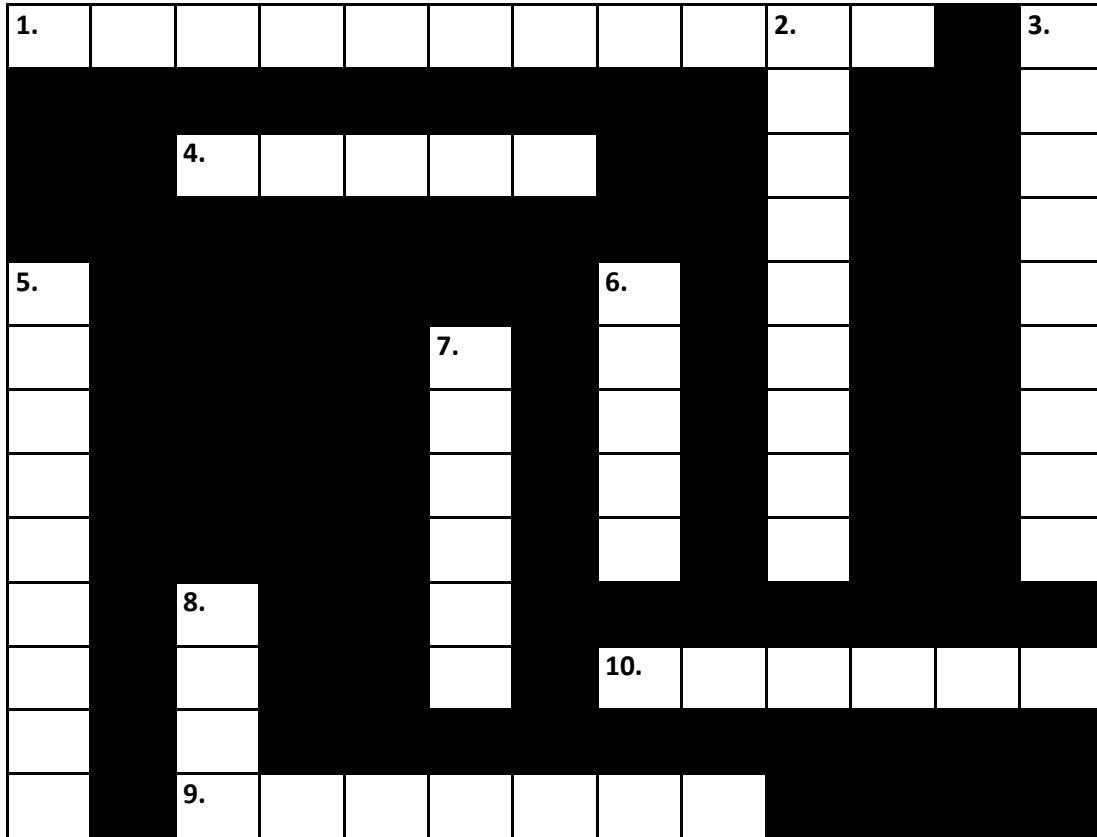

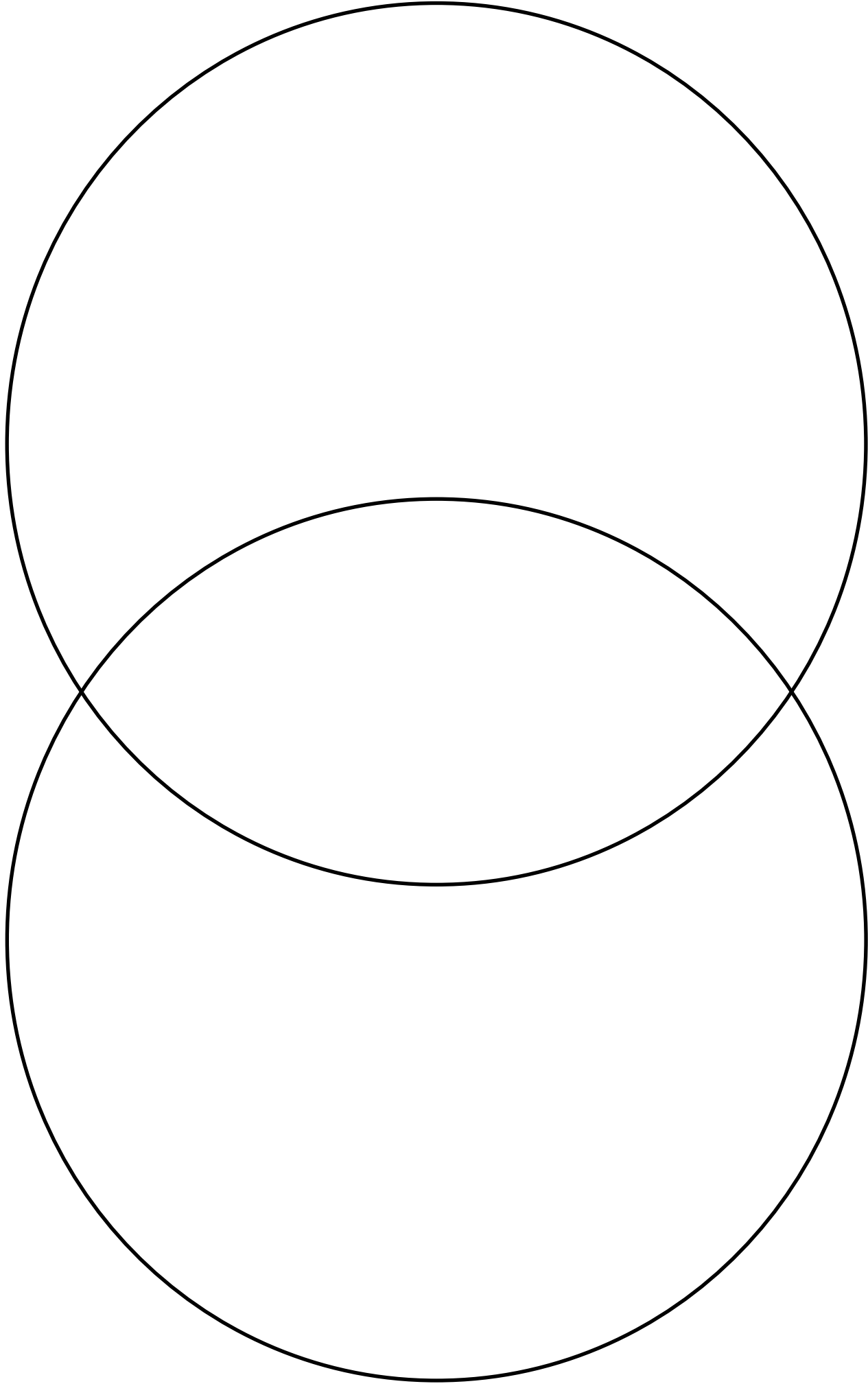
